

PLATYPUS - MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Sydney Harbour Federation Trust (Harbour Trust) is a Commonwealth government agency responsible for vision planning and management of 8 sites around Sydney Harbour, including Platypus on Neutral Bay in North Sydney. The Harbour Trust has a long-term vision plan for these sites to ensure they are integrated into the life of the city and create a lasting legacy for the people of Sydney and Australia.

To inform its development of a Management Plan for Platypus the Harbour Trust sought extensive public feedback through an Open Day, paper and online surveys, Community Advisory Committee (CAC) meetings, an extended Public Exhibition, a Drop-In Session and submissions.

On 8 December 2016 the Harbour Trust Board considered the Draft Management Plan for Platypus. The Harbour Trust carefully considered all submissions and approved the Management Plan with minor changes to address issues raised in submissions.

Based on the feedback received, the Harbour Trust has prepared and adopted a Plan that aims to:

- Create a waterfront urban park
- Protect, manage and interpret the site's heritage values
- Maximise public access to the site
- Revive the site with a mix of new uses that are compatible with the site's character and constraints
- · Protect local environment and amenity

Plan Possibilities

WE ASKED

In May 2016, the Harbour Trust hosted a Planning Open Day at Platypus with three Information Sessions and 626 attendees. Members of the public were able to complete a survey to provide feedback which informed the preparation of the Draft Management Plan. Input was also sought from members of the Harbour Trust Community Advisory Committees.



Key questions included:

- What is most important for the Harbour Trust to protect, interpret or provide at Platypus?
- What are the most important areas for ongoing site management?
- What makes this site special to you?
- What activities/changes would you like/not like to see?
- In what ways should the site's heritage be conveyed?

YOU SAID

The Harbour Trust received 358 responses (comprising 348 responses to the paper and online survey and 10 other submissions).




Top Priorities include:

Based on public feedback and in accordance with the Harbour Trust's Comprehensive Plan, a Draft Plan was prepared to provide for the following:




Plan Testing

WE ASKED

The Harbour Trust placed the Draft Plan on an extended 6-week Public Exhibition (from 12 August -23 September 2016). Input was also sought from members of the Harbour Trust Community Advisory Committees, key stakeholders, government organisations, local residents and the wider community.

YOU SAID

The Harbour Trust received 71 submissions and one petition (with 75 signatures) in response to the Public Exhibition of the Draft Plan. The top priorities and key concerns identified in the feedback included:






WE DID
