Speakers attend community groups, schools, libraries, and other organisations to share insights into the natural environment, First Nations connections, military heritage, and contemporary use of Harbour Trust sites, this includes current projects tied to the various Masterplans and management plans.

Participate in induction and ongoing training to stay up to date with Harbour Trust knowledge and resources. Provide feedback to the Harbour Trust team about presentations and audience engagement.
